# Ibex Trip Survey Results Briefing

This year's results are in. Thanks to everyone who took the time to fill out the survey as well as dealing with some technical trial and error.

More detailed results will come soon, but following is a high level synopsis of the results:

1. Week Long Trip – The front-runners are Europe, Alyeska and Utah
2. 4 to 5 Day Trip – Leaders are Crested Butte, Mammoth, Vail and Big Mountain
3. Most people prefer to ski 4 days with no days off for a 4-5 day trip
4. Important factors when choosing a trip – Overwhelmingly, destination came in first, time of year/ski season second. Cost was way low.
5. Other amenities – Accommodations and distance from airport or direct flight came in one and two far above the others
6. Other things to do – dinner was by far the favorite
7. Midwest ski trip was almost even with “yes” taking a slight edge
8. Chestnut/Sundown was first with Granite Peak a close second, Blackjack, MI came in third
9. Other types of trips or activities – Now here's a shocker, biking came in first followed by rafting and canoeing. Other high ranking activities are scuba and skiing in the Southern Hemisphere.

An additional Zoomerang survey will be sent out shortly to determine a good spot for the next New Year's trip. Keep in mind, as it is a holiday, prices are higher than they normally would be any other time of the season.

The destinations that Ibex went to this past year were not included in the survey but could be listed under “other.” For the week long trip it looks like a lot of people like Whistler.

Initial rides should be limited to 20-30 minutes, 3 days a week. Pedal briskly, but don't get out of breath. As fitness increases, begin riding 5 days a week for at least thirty minutes and progress from there.

If you are bored with the training route, ride it in the opposite direction. You will be amazed how different it seems.

One of the best ways to improve is to have a purpose on every ride. If you're riding with a group, like Ibex, practice your drafting skills by slipping in a paceline. On another day, do low-gear sprints to develop your spin, or try hill

# ***PARK CITY LIFT MALFUNCTION***

Park City Mountain Resort's (PCMR) popular PayDay lift malfunctioned Sunday morning (3/5/06), stranding almost 300 skiers and snowboarders, in what was the fourth time a PCMR lift has broken down with people on board in the past two ski seasons.

The resort and the lift's manufacturer, Doppelmayr CTEC, are perplexed by the breakdowns and promise a widened probe into the latest incident.

Krista Parry, the resort's spokeswoman, said 280 people were on PayDay when it malfunctioned at 11:15 a.m. The lift takes people from the Resort Center to mid-mountain. Parry said safety is PCMR's top priority and said that adequate money is spent on safety at the resort.

She said ski patrollers spent two hours and 40 minutes evacuating the stranded skiers and snowboarders using ropes.

The resort's ski patrol trains for such scenarios and conducted similar operations during the three previous breakdowns.

In February, the resort's Bonanza lift broke down with 175 people aboard, forcing their evacuation with ropes. In 2005, the Silverlode lift stopped working twice, necessitating rope evacuations each time.

The lift company theorizes that the gear box in PayDay failed, stopping the lift.

Jan Leonard, president, said the gear boxes installed in each of PCMR's four six-passenger lifts, more such lifts than any other mountain resort, were installed in the 1990s, before the lift manufacturer switched to a system made by Caterpillar. Previously, the gear boxes, including those in PCMR's six-passenger lifts, were made in Switzerland.

Leonard said 22 lifts in the U.S. use the Swiss-made gear boxes. Parry said PCMR intended to replace the gear box in PayDay with a Caterpillar model and ordered the new one three or four weeks ago. She said the resort is now considering whether to replace the gear boxes in each of the six-passenger lifts.

The resort planned to reopen PayDay Wednesday morning at the latest (3/8/06).
