- 3 of 4 day activity pass
- Round trip transportation to and from Anchorage airport
- Transportation to and from Anchorage for the start of the Iditarod Non-stop airfare on Alaska Airlines: AS131 ORD to ANC 7:15 PM to 11:04 PM on February 27 returning AS130 ANC to ORD 9:54 PM to 6:56 AM (March 4)

2008 will be leap year, so we get an extra day on February 29 (Glen and Pat will also have an actual birthday!). The flight on February 27 doesn't leave until 7:15 PM so you don't have to take the day off of work. The flight back does not leave until almost 10 PM therefore, you can ski on March 3. Additionally, the airport in Anchorage is only about 45 minutes away from the hotel, so



there won't be a ton of time spent in transit. The "activity pass" listed above is the lift ticket. You can exchange the lift ticket for another activity such as dinner, cross-country skiing or other activities if you don't feel like skiing that day, or if God forbid, you hurt yourself. Myth-busters: The temperature in Alyeska this time of year is basically the same as it is in Colorado due to the proximity of the ski area to the ocean. Alaska has about the same number of hours of daylight as the lower U.S., however it gets lighter a

little later in the morning and it stays lighter a little later in the evening.

**Cascade/Devil's Head (2/9 and 2/10)**  
- \$175.00, this 2 night package includes:

- Hotel accommodations
  - Lift tickets
- Wine and cheese party (or beer and cheese party – this is Wisconsin after all)



More details, such as the specific hotel, will be made available soon.

**Breckenridge with CMSC (3/29 to 4/5)** - \$1,136, this 7 night package includes:

- Round trip airfare to Denver
- Transportation to and from Breckenridge to airport
- Lift tickets

All sorts of activities and stuff (this is the CMSC trip after all), more details to come

As you can see, the prices have gone up over the years. This is due to a number of factors not the least of which is the CPI (consumer price index) and/or the old standby, gas prices. The trips above offer many extras such as breakfast everyday (Lake Tahoe and Salt Lake) and additional activities, which offset some of the cost. Lake Tahoe, Alyeska and Breckenridge offer ski in/out or pretty darn close. Additionally, they all offer direct flights (except for Wisconsin of course).

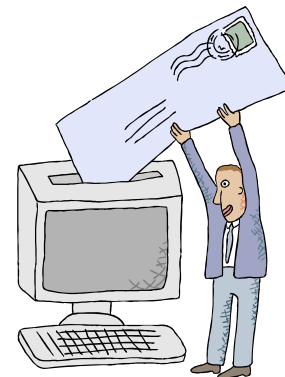
