Last Chance to ride the Gondola at Jackson Hole

Yes, its official, the Bridger Gondola at Jackson is planned to close September of 2006, thus this will be IBEX's last chance to ride the famous Gondola. Jackson Hole offers three 3 world-class ski areas. Jackson Hole Mountain Resort, located 11 miles from the town of Jackson in Teton Village, boasts one of the longest, steepest continuous vertical drops of any ski area in North America. You can ski 4,139 leg-burning, vertical feet from 10,450 feet down to 6,311 feet. JHMR gets people out on the hill with eight chairlifts, a gondola and aerial tram; and receives an average of 360 inches of snowfall per year. On the western slope of the Tetons, about 75 minutes by car from Jackson, Grand Targhee Ski and Summer Resort receives even more snow than Jackson Hole. Grand Targhee is routinely ranked among the top 3 resorts in North America in terms of snow quality and quantity. They offer snowcat skiing as well as lift service skiing on more than 300 groomed acres of trails. Snow King Resort, known as the town hill, offers night skiing, lunchtime hourly tickets, a terrain park, and a tubing park all on one very skiable, consistent pitch. Snow King is the ski area you see while standing in the town square or strolling along the boardwalks of Jackson. The mountain is rated at 10% beginner, 40% intermediate and 50% advanced/expert. Other Activities include snowmobiling, cross country skiing, snowshoeing and dog sledding and wildlife

They have taken a bit of the rough edge off with the new base amenities, but the mountain didn't change. The cost of all this fun and skiing is an amazing \$930.00, that's only \$40 dollars more than the 2003 trip to Jackson. Join Janine and I in Jackson Hole Wyoming to bring in the New Year for 2006.

Lesson Procedures

for members and children of members:

If you or your child, are interested in taking free lessons on any of the IBEX trips, here are the steps to follow:

- **Sign-up with the trip leader for that trip.** You will be asked to provide the following:
 - o Refundable deposit of \$10 for each lesson
 - o Determine which type of lesson you want (Ski or Snowboard)
 - o Determine what level of lesson you need
- If you are signing up a minor (under age 21), complete a waiver for the minor. Only one waiver is required for the entire season!

Deposits:

- Members signing up for lessons will need to make a \$10 refundable deposit for each lesson. This can be in the form of cash or a check.
- A deposit is required for each lesson.
- This deposit is refundable at the end of the trip, if the member or member's child attends the lesson. If attendance does not occur the refund will not be made.
- If a deposit is not given by the last meeting prior to the trip departure date, the member runs the risk of not being allowed in the lesson. It is up to the instructor's discretion to include the member based on class size and lesson planned.
- Any arrangements for private lessons are outside the scope of this policy.

Lessons:

- There will be at least 1 lesson given for every 3 "trip" days of the trip. For example a 4 day trip will have 1 lesson. A week-long trip will have 2 lessons.
- If a member is signing up for only 1 lesson on a trip with more than 1 lesson scheduled, it must be the first lesson as subsequent lessons build on the previous and are based on the skills of the particular class participants.

Group versus Private lessons:

All lessons are considered Group lessons to benefit the entire membership. Arrangements CAN be made for private lessons and are outside the scope of this policy. Contact the instructor of your choice to make arrangements.

As of 8/29/05 we have three cabins full. If by chance, you haven't made up your mind or maybe a surprise vacation comes your way we will be able to offer three bedroom cabins for the late sign-ups.

Wilderness Resort offers many other pleasures, hiking, biking, shopping, on site Spa, or just hanging out. Don't forget your swim suit, there are three indoor/outdoor water parks on site. Wilderness Resort and Golf Club is located on Lake Delton at Exit 92 off I-90-94 to Hwy. 12, West one mile.

There are three restaurants on site as well as a sports bar, The Thirsty Buffalo.

Wilderness Woods Golf Club is an imaginative layout featuring 18-holes of Championship Golf, carefully set among acres of scenic Wisconsin Dell countryside. From tricky doglegs to spacious fairways to dramatic water hazards, Wilderness Woods offers a wide and challenging array of golf shots. I suspect Ibex members will have more shots than the course architect planned on. The Milwaukee Journal Sentinel calls Wilderness "One of the Top 25 Courses in the State"

This year's package includes two rounds of golf and cart, lodging in a FIVE BEDROOM ENTERTAINMENT CABIN. The cabins are 3,500 square feet in size with secluded golf course view, bar, den, deck, and entertainment room with a big screen TV. We have included a cookout style dinner Saturday night on the deck. The club will provide steak or chicken, drinks, side dish and snacks for dinner. I suggest that you bring a supply of your favorite beverage, 'cause we may not supply your choice.

The total package is **\$193.00** for both days of golf, non-golfers will be able to join the group for **\$ 85.00**.

Friday arrivals will stay in the same cabins for the weekend. The cost of Friday night will be divided equally between those that stay in the cabins. Friday night dinner is on your own, we can grill on the deck or go out, your choice.
